OCA CIRCULAR NO. 41-2022

TO:

ALL CONCERNED JUDGES, COURT PERSONNEL AND COURT USERS OF THE FIRST AND SECOND LEVEL COURTS IN AREAS PLACED UNDER ALERT LEVELS 1 AND 2 PER IATF RESOLUTION NO. 163-A

SUBJECT: COURT OPERATIONS FROM 1 MARCH 2022 UNTIL FURTHER ORDERS OF THE COURT

Pursuant to the authority granted by Chief Justice Alexander G. Gesmundo, and as the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF) issued IATF Resolution No. 163-A dated 27 February 2022 placing provinces, highly urbanized cities (HUCs), and independent component cities (ICCs) under their respective Alert Levels 1 and 2 classifications effective 1 to 15 March 2022, court operations in the concerned areas from 1 March 2022 until further orders of the Court shall be governed by the applicable provisions of OCA Circular No. 134-2021 dated 5 November 2021, as amended by OCA Circular No. 146-2021 dated 29 November 2021, subject to adjustments on the required skeleton workforce and operational policies, as follows:

AREAS UNDER ALERT LEVEL 1

LUZON

National Capital Judicial Region

Cordillera Administrative Region (CAR): Abra, Apayao, Baguio City, Kalinga;

Region 1: Dagupan City, Ilocos Norte, Ilocos Sur, La Union, Pangasinan; Region 2: Batanes, Cagayan, City of Santiago, Isabela, Quirino;

Region 3: Angeles City, Aurora, Bataan, Bulacan, Olongapo City, Pampanga, Tarlac:

Region 4A: Cavite, Laguna;

Region 4B: Marinduque, Puerto Princesa City, Romblon; and, Region 5: Naga City, Catanduanes.

VISAYAS

Region 6: Aklan, Bacolod City, Capiz, Guimaras; Region 7: Siquijor; and,

Region 8: Biliran.

MINDANAO

Region 9: Zamboanga City;

Region 10: Cagayan de Oro City, Camiguin; and,

Region 11: Davao City

COURT OPERATIONS GUIDELINES (Alert Level 1) - cont.
For Judges without court space or facilities of their own, but they already have
their own personnel, maintain a skeleton workforce of at least 75%
Night courts are allowed to operate in stations where these have been
organized or required
Executive Judges may conduct jail visitations as provided for in OCA Circular
No. 107-2013 dated 30 August 2013
Flag raising/lowering ceremonies can be held

AREAS UNDER ALERT LEVEL 2

LUZON

Cordillera Administrative Region (CAR): Benguet, Ifugao, Mountain Province;

Region 2: Nueva Vizcaya;

Region 3: Nueva Ecija, Zambales;

Region 4A: Batangas, Lucena City, Quezon Province, Rizal;

Region 4B: Occidental Mindoro, Oriental Mindoro, Palawan; and,

Region 5: Albay, Camarines Norte, Camarines Sur, Masbate, Sorsogon.

VISAYAS

Region 6: Antique, Iloilo City, Iloilo Province, Negros Occidental; Region 7: Bohol, Cebu Province, Cebu City, Lapu-Lapu City, Mandaue City, Negros Oriental; and,

Region 8: Eastern Samar, Leyte, Northern Samar, Ormoc City, Southern Leyte, Tacloban City, Western Samar.

MINDANAO

Region 9: City of Isabela, Zamboanga del Sur, Zamboanga del Norte, Zamboanga Sibugay;

Region 10: Bukidnon, Iligan City, Lanao del Norte, Misamis Occidental, Misamis Oriental;

Region 11: Davao de Oro, Davao del Sur, Davao del Norte, Davao Oriental, Davao Occidental;

Region 12: General Santos City, North Cotabato, Sarangani, South Cotabato, Sultan Kudarat;

Region 13 (CARAGA): Surigao del Norte, Surigao del Sur, Agusan del Norte, Agusan del Sur, Butuan City, Dinagat Islands; and,

Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (BARMM): Basilan, Maguindanao, Sulu, Tawi-Tawi, Cotabato City, Lanao del Sur.

COURT OPERATIONS GUIDELINES (Alert Level 2)
Courts and judicial offices are PHYSICALLY OPEN
Maintain a skeleton workforce of at least 80% ²
For Judges without court space or facilities of their own, but they already have their own personnel, maintain a skeleton workforce of at least 50% to at most 75%
Night courts are not yet allowed to operate

In addition to the above, the following are the common court operations guidelines for areas under Alert Levels 1 and 2:

UMMON COURT OPERATIONS GUIDELINES (Alert Levels 1 & 2)
Pleadings, motions and other court submissions may be filed or served by
registered mail, through the services of duly accredited private couriers, or by
transmitting them through electronic mail in accordance with the existing
electronic filing guidelines
In case an area is placed under a conflicting Alert Level system and Community
Quarantine classification, as categorized herein, the more restrictive court
operation protocols as provided in the Alert Level system or Community
Quarantine classification shall prevail
Regular office hours as prescribed in OCA Circular No. 09-2015 dated 21
January 2015 shall be observed, i.e., Monday to Friday, 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M.
(for Judicial Regions 1 to 12) and 8:00 A.M. to 4:30 P.M. (for National Capital
Judicial Region)
For Saturday duty, the appropriate manpower complement shall be determined
 and scheduled by the concerned Executive Judge
Personal filing and follow-up of cases are allowed
Judges to give priority to in-court or face-to-face hearings and continue to
conduct videoconferencing hearings in the courtrooms ³ . A videoconferencing
hearing, as an alternative mode ⁴ to in-court proceedings, may be conducted in
instances enumerated in A.M. No. 20-12-01-SC dated 09 December 2020.

Accordingly, all other issuances of the Court or the Office of the Court Administrator (OCA) that are not consistent herewith will no longer be applicable to the courts in areas under either Alert Level 1 or 2.

All health and safety protocols against COVID-19 prescribed by the Court and the OCA, as well as those required by the IATF and the Department of Health, shall be complied with whatever is the Alert Level of a particular area.

In the event that there are pressing concerns that the Judges or court personnel may have regarding their operations from 1 March 2022, the same shall be referred to the OCA for appropriate action.
