NOTICE TO THE 2024 PHILIPPINE BAR APPLICANTS

Re: REFUND MECHANICS FOR THE 2024 PHILIPPINE BAR APPLICATION FEE

A request for refund of the 2024 Philippine Bar Application Fee will only be granted based on the grounds specified in Bar Bulletin No. 2¹ and other exceptional grounds. The request must be submitted on or before **September 6, 2024**, through the "Payment – Refund Request" section of the 2024 Office of the Bar Confidant (OBC) Helpdesk Form. Requests due to "change of mind" or unmeritorious reasons will not be considered. All pertinent requirements must be met for each ground, as follows:

Landbank account holders will receive the amount to be refunded through direct deposit to their provided accounts. Non-Landbank account holders will be issued checks, which they may pick-up from the OBC, subject to further arrangements. amply substantiate the applicant's highly meritorious reason (not limited to medical issues).

The sufficiency of the "highly meritorious reason" alleged by the applicant, the evaluation of the application for refund under this ground, and the amount that may be granted shall be at the discretion of the Office of the 2024 Bar Chairperson.

To be eligible for a refund, the applicants must satisfy the above criteria, submit their requests, and complete the documentation within the specified deadline. The *Notarized* Affidavit of Withdrawal of Bar Application and *Signed* Letter-Request for Refund of the 2024 Philippine Bar Application Fee, submitted under the second, third, and fourth grounds for refund, will result in the application being considered **irrevocably withdrawn** once it is acknowledged as received by the OBC. Applicants who withdrew are presumed to have understood the implications of their actions and shall be bound by them. However, withdrawal of the application does not guarantee an automatic grant of the refund request.

Please note that this notice pertains exclusively to claims for refunds of the 2024 Philippine Bar Application Fees and does not address refund requests for application fees paid for Bar Examinations in previous years.
